
Want to teach in a Catholic school?

The Catholic Institute of Western Australia offers Catholic Studies Units at Curtin University for Education students who want to teach in a Catholic school.

Early childhood and primary education students need to be a member of the Catholic Church and be able to teach Religious Education. There are three Catholic Studies units to be done to meet the tertiary study requirement for accreditation.

Secondary education students who wish to teach in a Catholic secondary school, including those who are Catholic and who may wish to teach RE, need to complete three Catholic Studies units to meet the tertiary study requirement for accreditation.

Accreditation



Children in Catholic primary schools are taught Religious Education by the classroom teacher.

To teach in a Catholic school, teachers must complete professional training that demonstrates an understanding and commitment to the Catholic identity of the school.

In a Catholic primary school or early childhood learning centre, classroom teachers must be members of the Catholic Church as they are required to teach Religious Education (RE). This form of accreditation is called

Accreditation to teach RE in a Catholic School.

In a Catholic secondary school, teachers who want to teach RE must be a member of the Catholic Church and will require *Accreditation to teach RE in a Catholic School*. For secondary teachers **not** teaching RE or who are not a Catholic, they will need to complete *Accreditation to Teach in a Catholic School*.

Both types of accreditation have a tertiary study component. The study component can be completed at University. To teach RE there is also an inservice offered by the Catholic Education Office which is completed **once employed** in a Catholic school.

Catholic Studies Units @ Curtin University

The Catholic Institute offers units at Curtin that assist Education students meet the tertiary study requirements of accreditation. Education students need to complete **three** units. These units are available:

- ❑ ED492 An Introduction to Catholic Education (Semester 1)
- ❑ ED493 Creed & Sacraments in Catholic Studies (Semester 2)
- ❑ ED494 Prayer & Morality in Catholic Studies (Semester 1)
