



## *Short Courses towards Accreditation for teaching and leading in Catholic Schools*

The Catholic Institute of Western Australia\* (CIWA) is offering short courses to teachers interested in completing their Accreditation to teach and/or lead in Catholic schools. The short courses consist of modules taught over two weeks in a mixed study mode with **two days of face-to-face classes** and the remainder via online activities and assessment items.

There are three short courses offered in 2018/19 as detailed below. Teachers completing Accreditation to Teach in a Catholic school will need to complete all three courses that include two assessments of 1500-2000 words in each course. If teachers are seeking to use the short courses towards Accreditation for Leadership, they will need to complete only CIWA602 and CIWA603. These courses include two assessments in each course of 2500-3000 words each.

*Unlike other offerings by CIWA at Edith Cowan University, these courses are **NOT** credited towards advanced standing in Education programs at universities.*

### **CIWA501 Catholic Schools in Western Australia**

*(This course can only be used for Accreditation to Teach in a Catholic school)*

This course outlines the distinctive features of Catholic schools in Western Australia. It presents the Catholic educational principles of the system and invites participants to consider how they are applied to Catholic schooling today. Recent developments in the curriculum and culture of Catholic school communities are outlined and how these developments are promoted to the wider community. Participants are invited to reflect critically on the ways staff are expected to support Catholic schools.

### **CIWA503/603 Christian witness within a Catholic school community**

This course outlines the example of Christian witness through prayer and Christian moral living. In particular, participants analyse and critique the Ten Commandments as moral guides for today and experience different forms of praying. The course explores the place of Jesus as the Way, Truth and Life in the Gospels as a model for Christian witness within a Catholic school community. Participants reflect critically on personal and professional capabilities to model prayer and teach core Catholic moral principles in Catholic schools.

## CIWA502/602 Celebration of Faith in a Catholic school community

This module outlines the core beliefs and rituals within the Catholic tradition. The core beliefs expressed in the Apostles' Creed are analysed to deepen participants' knowledge and understanding of the Catholic faith. Participants will explore the distinctive features of rituals called sacraments and especially the recent developments in the celebration of the Mass. Participants are invited to consider their personal and professional capabilities to model or teach core Catholic beliefs and rituals.
